WOMEN IN NON-TRADITIONAL CAREERS SCHOLARSHIP POLICY

This scholarship provides financial assistance to women in non-traditional careers who are attending Copiah-Lincoln Community College seeking a career and technical certificate or degree in the field of Automation & Control, Automotive Technology, Commercial Truck Driving, Computer Networking, Construction Equipment, Cybersecurity, Diesel Equipment, Electrical Technology, Electronics, Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning; Precision Machining, or Welding.

Criteria for Women in Non-Traditional Student Scholarships

- a. The WINC Scholarship is currently only available for the 2020 Spring semester. Application deadline is January 17, 2020.
- b. There is no requirement for full-time status to receive this scholarship; the scholarship will be applied to full time (FT) or part-time (PT) tuition amounts charged against the student's account.
- c. Applicants will be chosen based on financial need, program demand, and essay.
- d. The amount of this scholarship will be no less than \$500 but not to exceed tuition cost for In-State students.
- e. Out-of-State students will be eligible for this scholarship; however, the scholarship applies to the In-State portion of the tuition only. An Out-of-State student will be responsible for the entire amount of the "Out-of-State" portion of tuition due the College.
- f. Scholarship recipients must complete a follow-up survey to evaluate the effectiveness of this scholarship.

How to apply

- a. The applicant must write an essay (no less than 75 words) explaining why they need this scholarship.
- b. Complete this scholarship application and return application and essay to Copiah-Lincoln Community College Career & Technical Office, Attention: Renea Redd, P.O. Box 649, Wesson, MS 39191. Application may be mailed or hand delivered to the Fortenberry Building, Career and Technical Office.
