President's Message



Every five years, Co-Lin's faculty, staff, administration, students, and Board of Trustees come together to create a framework for what we

would like to achieve in the future. We call it our Strategic Plan, and its importance is rooted in its role as a roadmap for meeting our goals. Its legitimacy comes from the voices it represents. Each person invested in Co-Lin's success has a chance to provide input that helps us recognize and address areas for improvement, growth, and innovation.

Its creation began over the summer of 2019 at the President's Leadership Retreat. Using the statewide strategic planning goals as our guide, subcommittees for the components of our plan were formed with the idea that we would collect data from all our stakeholders. We wanted to ensure that our decisions were driven by this information, and we wanted everyone to have a chance to be heard, with an "all hands on deck" approach to brainstorming.

Five years ago, the Vision 2020 plan was implemented for 2015-2020. Some objectives that we saw come to fruition from that plan were increases in the use of instructional technology, saving our students a great deal of money, program expansion in multiple areas (particularly Dual Enrollment), and the rebranding of the Counseling Center to help students navigate the path to completion. These are just a few of the seeds that were planted, and we are still seeing their successful growth.

Beginning this year, with the theme of "Constant Forward Progress", we reflect on the positive decisions of the last plan and ask ourselves, what could we have done better? There are lessons in both our successes and those plans which did not meet our expectations. I encourage you to ask yourself "what if" as we move forward - "what ifs" that are guided by the past but focused on the future, "what ifs" that are informed and optimistic. What if I can change just one thing to improve my students' experience? What if I were willing to look at this circumstance from another perspective? What if I can help open more lines of communication within my office, my classroom, my department, my community?

I'm excited for what Co-Lin's future holds. I know there is no limit to where we will go together. Join me as we march toward 2025.

Steering toward increased opportunities for teaching, learning, and student success

State Plan Goals:

(a) To provide degree and certification programs delivered through traditional and distance education courses that prepare students for continued studies and/or employment.

State Plan Strategies:

- Continue to promote excellence in classroom instruction to help students move towards degree completion. This will include remedial coursework where necessary, as well as emphasis on student retention and persistence.
- Enhance the ability of the college to offer top-quality career-technical instruction by seeking external funding to assist with the purchase of instructional equipment and funding for additional support positions focusing on recruitment and retention.
- Align a diverse array of programs in the community based on local needs of the citizens of the district through cooperation with local agencies and school districts.

College Objectives:

- Establish new STEM programs on all campuses.
- Implement peer-to-peer instructional support (seasoned faculty will mentor/advise early career faculty who are within three years of onboarding with the college).
- Establish a set of guidelines which ensure consistency in instructional quality and accountability based on the state guided curriculum within Academic Divisions and CTE Pathways.
- Develop personalized faculty professional development plans for all programs.
- Review course data to ensure continuous improvement.
- Enhance programs and partnerships with universities to allow seamless transfer for completion.
- Continue to encourage instructor utilization of and broaden student access to instructional technology in all learning.
- Develop strategies to communicate and advise students and parents in high schools about pros and cons of dual enrollment.
- Continue to solicit external funding to support professional development and institutional programs through the Co-Lin Foundation and grant opportunities.
- Obtain retention software to assist with identifying "at-risk" students to increase communication and offer resources available through support services.



Strive Instructional Support

Embracing technology as a tool for enhancing instruction and college operations

State Plan Goals:

(a) To provide access and assistance for students to library materials and learning resources; may include learning resource laboratories and material for special application of studies.

State Plan Strategies:

• Continue to maintain and upgrade library and learning resource materials; have support staff and learning resource laboratories available for students during the morning and evening hours.

College Objectives:

- Upgrade career-technical equipment on all campuses to ensure latest technology meets industry demands.
- Enhance instruction in the Associate Degree Nursing program through the addition of a computer lab in the Stribling building.
- Upgrade existing instructional technology in the academic departments on all campuses.
- Expand library access on the weekends to support student learning.
- Research feasibility of providing access for students to purchase technology in the Co-Lin bookstore to assist with instructional support and if feasible, implement a plan and process.


College Objectives:




