APPLY TO COPIAH-LINCOLN COMMUNITY COLLEGE

- 1. Complete a Copiah-Lincoln Community College Application.
- 2. Send Official transcript from your high school or submit GED/HSE scores to the Office of Enrollment Services.
- 3. Send ACT scores (minimum composite score of 16 and a minimum score of 14 in math and reading required for PN program) to the Office of Enrollment Services.
- 4. Send official transcripts from any colleges you have attended to the Office of Enrollment Services.
- 5. Apply for financial aid

PN SELECTION PROCESS REQUIREMENTS

- 6. Have on file with Co-Lin recommended ACT score of 16 or above with a 14 or above in math and reading.
- 7. Complete the online Practical Nursing Application
- 8. Take the ATI TEAS ® In-Person Proctor Exam before the admission deadline. Remote online scores are **NOT accepted**. Previous scores can be submitted to <u>hope.berry@colin.edu</u> for review.

Selection is based on PN admission rubric which includes ACT score, ATI TEAS ® score and previously taken college courses.

If selected, participate in a criminal history background check and drug and alcohol testing

How can I send my official high school transcript to Co-Lin?

Call or visit your high school and request that an official transcript be sent to Co-Lin.

What is the ATI TEAS® exam?

The Assessment Technologies Institute TEAS® exam is a computerized test specifically designed to assist in the selection of practical nursing students.

When and where can I take the ATI TEAS®?

The exam will be administered on the Copiah-Lincoln Community College campuses. The approximate time for the examination is 3 ½ hours. Register for the exam by visiting <u>https://www.atitesting.com/teas/register</u>. You must bring a picture I.D. on the date of testing.

How do I prepare for the ATI TEAS® exam and when will I get my results? You can purchase an ATI TEAS Basic Study package at www.atitesting.com. Your ATI TEAS® results will be available to you on your testing date.

What if I've already taken the ATI TEAS® exam?

If you have taken the ATI TEAS® Exam and would like to use those scores, please login to ATI @ www.atitesting.com to retrieve your scores and email to <u>hope.berry@colin.edu</u>. Copiah-Lincoln Community College will accept scores taken within the last 3 years from current testing date. Remote proctoring scores will not be accepted.
