 - Wolf Alert is the college's emergency alert and notification system, which is delivered using RAVE. In the event of an emergency, Wolf Alert delivers rapid, multiplatform messages to students, faculty members, and staff. This is the best source for timely information and instruction on what to do in the event of any campus emergency such as severe weather, power outages, criminal activity, or other threats. Student Success

Co-Lin recently ranked No. 1 in student success among all 15 Mississippi community colleges. This is the third consecutive year Co-Lin has captured the number one ranking in student success.

- GPA
 - Any student who does not earn at least a 1.5 GPA for work attempted during a given semester will be placed on Academic Probation at the end of that semester. A student who does not earn at least a 1.5 GPA for work attempted for 2 consecutive semesters will be placed on academic suspension at the end of the second semester. A student placed on Academic Suspension will not be eligible to attend the following fall, spring, or summer semester.
- Honors
 - Each semester, full-time students who achieve a 3.20 GPA are selected for the Honor Roll.
 Fulltime students with a 3.60 GPA are placed on the Vice-President's List, and full-time students who have a 4.00 GPA are placed on the President's List.
- Class Attendance Policy
 - Regular class attendance is very important to college success; therefore, students are expected to attend class unless it is absolutely necessary to be absent. Students are expected to make up all work missed due to absences.
 - MWF Classes......6 absences allowed cut from class on 7th
 - MW Classes......4 absences allowed cut from class on 5th
 - TR Classes4 absences allowed cut from class on 5th
 - Certain programs/activities have special attendance requirements due to the nature of the subject matter taught, clinical component, and/or state/national accreditation. In these programs, attendance requirements will be communicated through course syllabi and/or program policies. Other Important Information

- Buckley Amendment Waiver
 - Students may grant permission to Copiah-Lincoln Community College personnel to provide information to parents or legal guardians and/or to other parties designated on any and all matters pertaining to curriculum, grades, and financial statements. A Buckley Amendment Waiver (FERPA) Form is available in the Office of Enrollment Services at the Wesson campus, Natchez campus and the Simpson County Center.
- Artificial Intelligence (Generative AI) Policy
 - Copiah-Lincoln Community College acknowledges that large language model generative AI tools (ChatGPT, Dall-E 2, etc.) are readily accessible. The ethical and responsible use of AI tools can enhance student learning and productivity. However, the use of generative AI should be used as an aid to student work, not as a replacement. The use of AI is prohibited in courses unless otherwise noted by the instructor.
- Graduation
 - Each student is responsible for checking on his/her credits, scheduling of subjects, and otherwise meeting requirements for graduation. The counselors and faculty advisors will assist in planning a schedule and program, but the final responsibility rests with the student. Candidates for graduation should file their applications with Enrollment Services on their respective campus for diploma or departmental certificate by the posted deadline each semester. A non-refundable graduation fee of \$40 is charged to each student participating in the graduation ceremony. The fee, which is subject to change, is due and payable at the time of application for graduation
